Make comments and ask questions about books
Act out favourite stories using props
Make marks and draw pictures inspired by the
stories we have shared
Phonics: listening games, alliteration and rhyme

Numbers, Shape, Measures and Patterns

Number Rhymes and Songs
Counting to 10
Recognising numbers
Subitizing – noticing numbers and patterns
Comparing different times of day - sequencing
Counting objects – learning to point and count
Sorting objects

Exploring pattern and shapes in the environment Comparing objects by size and weight using correct vocabulary – long, short, longer, shorter, heavy, light
