Uniform Policy

2026-2027

Our Vision

Our school vision is for all pupils to flourish academically, spiritually and socially. Wearing the correct uniform helps children to flourish academically, by preventing distractions caused by fashion trends. Wearing a uniform helps children to flourish spiritually and socially, because it fosters a sense of community and equality among pupils.

Everyday Uniform

- Black trousers or knee-length shorts
- Black pinafore or black skirt (skirts should be knee-length or longer to ensure they are appropriate for school. We kindly ask that shorter skirts are not worn)
- Blue and white summer dress (optional in warmer months)
- White polo shirt (no logo)
- Plain black shoes or plain black trainers (the sole may be white). No platform soles or high heels. (*see example pictures below*)
- Black tights or white socks for girls
- Black socks for boys
- Navy blue sweatshirt (school logo optional)
- Navy blue cardigan (school logo optional)
- Navy blue book bag (school logo optional)

PE Kit

Children must wear their PE kit to school on PE days.

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black knee-length shorts, leggings, or jogging bottoms
- Plain black PE pumps/trainers
- In cold weather, children are welcome to wear their school jumper over the top of their t-shirt

Jewellery/Watches

For safety reasons:

- Jewellery is not permitted, except for small stud earrings. Jewellery worn for religious reasons is also not permitted during the school day
- Earrings must be removed for PE and swimming lessons
- Watches – to be analogue or digital. No Smart Watches. Fitbits may be worn.

Hair

- Hair that is shoulder length or longer should be tied back for reasons of safety and hygiene and to support learning. Parents/carers should provide hair bobbles or suitable hair ties.
- Hair should not be brightly coloured.
- Coloured hair braids are not permitted.

Makeup/nails

Make-up, false nails and false eyelashes are not permitted. Nail varnish is not permitted.

The importance of naming uniform items

All uniform items should be clearly named, including coats, as we do not have space to store lost property.

Affordability

We have made every effort to ensure that our school uniform is affordable for parents and carers. To keep costs down, there are only two items of clothing – sweatshirts and cardigans – that include the school logo, though the logo is not compulsory.

Second-Hand Uniform

Please speak to the school office for further information if you are interested in clean, good quality second hand uniform. We keep a stock of second-hand uniform in the main entrance. We welcome donated uniform if washed and in good condition.

Non-uniform days
