CPD for staff- £710.00

We plan to invest some of our budget in CPD for staff. The money will be used to support with a variety of CPD skills such as: behaviour management, upskilling qualifications and team-teach opportunities. We hope that offering a breadth of CPD opportunities, PE staff will be equipped to deliver a high-quality teaching and learning experience in this subject area.

Equipment and resources- £2,000.00

This year, we plan to purchase some new equipment which will further enhance the extensive extracurricular provision we offer at St Peter's. We hope to purchase some new bikes and scooters for EYFS-year 6 in order to further encourage a progression of physical skills when manipulating gross motor equipment. We also hope that opportunities to learn how to ride a bike will prepare the children with the confidence and skills needed for Bikeability in year 6. We plan to work with 'ED start' to develop our range or resources to support the range of extra-curricular clubs on offer. We hope this will not only increase engagement, but provide sustainability of the sports we are offering.

Extra-curricular activities- £3,000.00

At St Peter's, we pride ourselves on offering the children opportunities to access a range of sports both inside and out of the classroom. For children whose strengths do not lie in core sport, it is important we offer alternative sporting opportunities which will increase enjoyment and enthusiasm for physical activity. This year, we are working alongside the highly reputable 'ED start' we hope that through shared visions and careful planning around children's interests our extra-curricular provision will be further desirable to a wider catchment of children.

Support staff CPD- £2,400.00

As always, we endeavor to upskill staff at St Peter's by providing opportunities for CPD. We hope this will equip them with many transferrable skills and give them confidence to deliver engaging and high-quality teaching sessions of their own.

Outdoor adventurous opportunities- £2,700.00

We understand the importance of offering children access to adventurous activities they may have not experienced before. Children enjoy the activity days we offer because it gives them the opportunity to work with their peers and participate in more unusual sporting opportunities. They develop many valuable skills in addition to being physically active for sustained periods. This year we are looking into sports such as: bowling, archery, skateboarding and many more.

Commando Joe- £1000.00

We will continue to offer the Commando Joe program at St Peter's this year. Subscribing to this program, gives us access to a range of adventurous activity modules and an assessment tracker where each classes' contribution towards key skills can be monitored.

School Games competitions- £500.00

One of the things we wish to improve at St Peter's is the engagement with wider competition opportunities. We hope to participate in one competition every term with a view to increasing this. In addition, we will be planning for more intra-school competitions.

Swimming- £5,500.00

Swimming has been a very important part of the Physical Education curriculum at St Peter's. The contribution of this funding will have a significant impact on the progress of the children and their achievements by the end of year 6.

We will use our main school budget to meet the requirements set out in the PE national curriculum programme of study for swimming. The sports grant funding element will be used to enhance the curriculum for children who have already met statutory requirements.
