### **Our Christian Vision and Values**

1 John 3:18 Dear Children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth

Our Christian values, which derive from the life and teaching of Jesus, underpin every aspect of school life at St. Peter's. These core values are 'Hope, Honesty and Compassion' and our branch values 'Community, Love and Respect' are at the core of everything we do to ensure our children believe in themselves and develop strong relationships with others.

Because we have **hope**, we believe that problems can be solved, and difficult situations can be improved; we look for potential in every child.

By being honest, we can trust each other; we try to be honest even when we find it difficult.

We show **compassion** to each other and to people outside of our school who need our help. This makes our school and the world around us a better place.

Through our Christian values, we strive to enrich the lives of our worshipping community and grow in confidence and self-esteem. St. Peter's is a place where we learn in order to love God, one another and ourselves. A rich and varied curriculum enables us to discover the wonders of God's creation, the worth of other people and allows our children to flourish in a happy, safe environment.



#### **CURRICULUM AND ORGANISATION**

We follow the Bury Agreed Syllabus\_which retains its emphasis on RE contributing to the personal development of pupils. RE is not simply about gaining knowledge and understanding about religions and beliefs. It also helps pupils to develop their own worldviews – their own understanding of the world and how to live, in the light of their learning, developing understanding, skills and attitudes. It makes a significant contribution to pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development, as well as important opportunities for exploring British values. The syllabus also maintains the required study of religions and beliefs (religious and non-religious worldviews) in each key stage, with scope for including worldviews represented locally, both religious and non-religious. The syllabus continues to offer open, enquiring, exploratory RE, suitable for pupils who have a religious faith of their own as well as for those who have no religious background.

### PRAYER AND LITURGY

Prayer, worship and liturgical celebration are central to our school day. Prayer is encouraged in a variety of methods; private individual prayer, group prayer, and whole school prayer.

Each child takes part in a daily act of worship (5-10 minutes) and formal prayers are used to open and close the school day sessions. The children also plan and lead acts of worship within each of their classes. Collective Worship across every class uses the same structure. We gather, using prayers, actions, or music. Then, we listen to scripture, readings and / or poems. After that, we respond by doing something or saying a prayer together. Finally, we go forth by reflecting on the scripture and taking this forward into our work throughout the day. It is wonderful to see the children excited, enthusiastic and deepening their faith through prayer and liturgy.

# **TEACHING METHODS, DIFFERENTIATION AND ASSESSMENT**

The RE scheme of work has been planned to incorporate the range of teaching and learning styles to enable greater access for all pupils. Within each unit of work there are opportunities for children to participate in a range of activities to show their understanding of the lesson/subject e.g. role play, watch and respond to video material, painting, reading and writing, listening to or composing music etc. We use 'Snowflakes' (Y3-6) and 'Reflections (Y1-2) for children to recall and understand their learning, give them opportunities to share their own opinions and encounters with the world and reflect on their learning.
