Sport Premium Funding



2020-21

Our allocation of PE and Sport Premium for the academic year September 2020 to August 2021 is expected to be ± 17750.00 .

The breakdown of how we plan on spending the money is as follows:

£4680: Swimming

We have spent some of our budget on swimming lessons for Year 4 and 5 (2 x two weekly intensive courses) and a two week booster session for Year 6. This is to improve the swimming achievements for children who have already met the requirements of the national curriculum programme of study. For those who have not met the requirements of the programme of study, money has been allocated from the main school budget.

£3000: Curriculum enhancements (half-termly)

We are offering children a wider range of physical activities (which they wouldn't normally have access to) in order to increase participation in sport and engagement with physical activity. We hope by providing targeted activities this will encourage engagement from the least active pupils. We are also intending to increase opportunities for physical activity outside of the core PE lesson. We have invested in the Commando-Joe programme which will be embedded into our curriculum and extra-curricular provision. We hope this will also increase the opportunity to provide 'active lessons' as all teaching staff are now trained in this programme.

£4500: Extra-curricular provision

We plan to hire qualified sports coaches/specialists to work alongside support staff and deliver a range of extra-curricular sports such as: dance, gymnastics, tag rugby, multi-sports, dodge-ball and cross-country. We hope that by investing in specialist coaches we can develop the skills of support staff to eventually be able to facilitate these sports clubs.

<u>£1500:</u> Teaching Assistants working with coaches to support the sessions and develop their knowledge of coaching sports sessions

We have a teaching assistant at each club so they can improve their own skills and support the coaches in teaching the children new skills. They support the attainment of children in sessions and use their new knowledge and skills to target next steps. By involving internal staff in sporting activities, we hope this will contribute to sustainability through confidence gained from upskilling through the CPD opportunities offered.

£2500.00: Purchase of new sports equipment for clubs

We have purchased new sports equipment to enhance our extra-curricular provision and facilitate clubs. We have also invested in bikes and scooters as this is an area in which we hope to encourage participation from EYFS-Y6. We hope that this will increase active play

at break times and lunchtimes and additionally raise the profile of PE for current and future pupils.

£1000.00: Competitions

We plan to purchase a school games membership. This will provide access to CPD for staff and the subject leader. It will also allow children to take on leadership roles which support the delivery of sport and physical activity throughout the school. This will also enable us to actively encourage pupils' participation in the School Games; entering sport competitions within the local area.

£500.00: CPD for PE staff

We aim to provide CPD opportunities for the PE specialist. We hope this will further increase confidence, knowledge and skills of PE teaching by equipping them with appropriate training and resources to raise the profile of PE and sport and embed physical activity across the school.
